

Favorite Songs To Be Sung By Richard Crooks Monday

"My Wild Irish Rose" Will Highlight Wallenstein Concert Program; Santa To Visit Kiddies In Studio

Richard Crooks' interpretation of Alcott's ever-popular "My Wild Irish Rose" will highlight the Wallenstein concert Monday at 8:30 p. m., over WEAJ. Crooks also will sing Tosti's "Parted," "Come Where My Love Lies Dreaming" by Foster, and Federico's Lament from Cilea's "L'Arlesiana."

Alfred Wallenstein will conduct the orchestra in the Introduction to Act III of Wagner's "Lohengrin" to open the program. Other orchestral selections will include Pierne's "Entrance of the Little Fauns" and the "Dance of the Camoristi" by Wolf-Ferrari.

Santa Claus will stage a sneak preview when he pays an advance visit to 400 youngsters brought to the WEAJ studio by the Salvation Army. During the broadcast at 10:00 p. m., Monday, St. Nick will be assisted by Josef A. Pasternack, Lullaby Lady Opal Craven and the quartet and orchestra, with clown Carl Marx as an added guest.

Appropriate Christmas music will be heard, featured by Opal Craven's solo, "Silent Night," and following the broadcast S. Claus will open his gift sack to the delight of the youngsters.

Connie Boswell, southern songstress, will be Alec Templeton's special guest of honor during the Monday broadcast at 9:30 p. m., over WEAJ. Singing star of Good News of 1940 show, Miss Boswell will blend her unusual arrangements of the day's hits with Templeton's piano improvisations.
