Burgess Meredith, one of the most distinguished actors on the Broadway stage, will play the title role, America Vespucci, at the premiere of Cavalcade of America on Tuesday over WJZ at 9 p. m.

Meredith, who won wide acclaim with his work in the Maxwell Anderson plays, "Winterset" and "High Tor," is already well-known.
