

"One Sunday Afternoon" Will Be Kate Smith Show Feature

Art Smith, Prominent Broadway Actor, To Play Leading Role Of Biff Grimes For Group Theatre

Art Smith, prominent Broadway actor, will play the leading role of Biff Grimes in the Group theatre's revival of James Hagan's serio-comedy "One Sunday Afternoon" on the "Kate Smith Hour" over WABC Friday at 8 p. m.

Kate will introduce her usual array of featured artists including Abbott and Costello, the Ted Straeter vocal group, Parker Fennelly and Arthur Allen in another of their humorous "Snow Village Sketches", Jack Miller's band and Ted Collins.

Music for the program will include three songs by Kate Smith. "After All," "White Lies and Red Roses," and "Bluebirds in the Moonlight." With the Straeter singers she will offer "I Hit a New High." The chorus will sing "You're a Lucky Guy" and "El Rancho Grande" in swing time. Jack Miller's orchestra will play a special arrangement of "Punishment Fits the Crime" from the "Hot Mikado."

On the last Friday program before moving to a Thursday 8 p. m. spot George Jessel will present Dale Carnegie, Anita Louise and Dr. Henry Linn on his "Celebrity Program" over WEAF at 9:30 p. m. Dr. Linn is an instructor at Teachers college, Columbia university, where he teaches janitors how to perform their duties. Music is by Peter Van Steeden's orchestra with vocals by the Merry Maes.
