

President On Radio Monday Night At Jackson Day Meet

Democrats To Convene In Washington With Program Scheduled For Airwaves From 10 To 10:30 P. M.

Indication of the White House stand on the approaching 1940 campaign is expected to be given during President Franklin D. Roosevelt's address to the annual Jackson Day Dinner of the Democratic party Monday, to be broadcast from 10:00 to 10:30 p. m. over WJZ.

Postmaster General James A. Farley, presiding at the main dinner at the Mayflower hotel in Washington, will introduce the President, whose remarks will be heard at celebrating dinners all over the country.

Senator Burton K. Wheeler, Democrat from Montana, will be heard in a Jackson Day address from the Albany hotel, Denver, Colorado, from 11:15 to 11:45 p. m. over WEA F.

Alec Templeton, young English musician whose piano pyrotechnics are heard from Chicago on Mondays over WEA F at 9:30 p. m., will move to New York City for five broadcasts beginning Monday. The program will be broadcast from NBC's studio 8H — largest radio studio in the world.

Sylvia Froos, blues singer, will be on hand when Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou hold their weekly party over WEA F Monday at 8:00 p. m. A vaudeville trouper at seven, Miss Froos has been featured frequently over NBC and also has appeared in motion pictures. Betty Lou's vocal contribution will be "Tiny Tim the Tinker," with Freddie Rich's orchestra.

A typical Kostelanetz arrangement of the novelty song, "London Bridge is Falling Down," will be heard on the conductor's "Tune-Up Time" program over WABC Monday at 8 p. m. Kostelanetz will also offer "It's a Blue World" from his new picture, "Music in My Heart" with a vocal by Tony Martin. Guest soloist with the new chorus will be Mary Small who sings "You're a Lucky Guy." An additional Kostelanetz presentation will be "All the Things You Are."

A summary of his opinions about "the shape of things to come" will be given by John Gunther, famous author and analyst of world events, when he concludes his series of commentaries for the National Broadcasting Company with two talks over WJZ Monday and Friday at 9:30 p. m., EST. He will leave New York immediately after the last broadcast for a vacation in Florida.

Gunther, author of "Inside Europe" and "Inside Asia," was sent to Europe on a roving commission for NBC when the war crisis began to develop last June. After reporting the situation in various nations surrounding Germany he returned to America in mid-September.
