

Benny Goodman Will Visit Templeton Show On Monday

King Of Swing To Cut Capers With Master Of Ivories; Tommy Riggs Has Guest Singer

America's king of swing, Benny Goodman, whose scepter is his clarinet, will take the guest spotlight on Alex Templeton Time when he visits the wizard of the keyboard Monday at 9:30 p. m. over WEAf.

Goodman will slip away from his orchestra long enough to cut a few swing capers with one of his most ardent admirers, who will join him in a duet.

During the broadcast, which will originate from NBC's New York studios on this date, the keyboard kibitzer will be assisted by Pat O'Malley, monologist; the chorus directed by William Miller, and Daniel Saidenberg's orchestra.

A musical salute to Finland will feature the Contented program Monday at 10:00 p. m. over WEAf when works by Sibelius and Jarnefelt are performed by Josef A. Pasternack and the orchestra. They include Sibelius' "Finlandia" and "Valse Triste," and Jarnefelt's "Praeludium." The Continental Quartet, Opal Craven, the Lullaby Lady and the ensemble will offer other traditional Finnish melodies.

Delectable Dinah Shore, tantalizing Tennessee blues singer, will be featured as guest soloist on Tommy Riggs Quaker Party Monday at 8:00 p. m. over WEAf. The young Southerner is the first performer to appear a second time as a guest star on the program. She made her first visit last summer.

Dinah's performance will mark another advance in her spectacular rush to the top of the ladder in broadcasting. Less than two years ago the young songstress was a demure co-ed at Vanderbilt university in Tennessee. She began her career on stations in Nashville and then came to New York to the networks.

The prelude tenor aria from Mascagni's "Cavalleria" will be Richard Crooks' feature solo during the program, Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAf. Crooks also will sing "In Moonlight" by Elgar. Clutson's "I Know of Two Bright Eyes" and "All Thru the Night." Alfred Wallenstein will conduct the orchestra in the Overture to Herold's "Zampa," Grieg's Symphonic Dance No. 2, and the Vaquero's Song and Habanera from Victor Herbert's "Natoma."

Andre Kostelanetz pays tribute to Stephen Foster, the famed composer, with a medley of five Foster songs on his "Tune-Up Time" program over WARC Monday at 8 p. m. The salute of Kostelanetz is particularly fitting because he initiated the movement to bring about the issuance of a Stephen Foster memorial stamp next May. Songs he will present include "Old Folks at Home," "Jeannie With the Light Brown Hair," "Camp-town races," "My Old Kentucky Home" and "Oh, Susannah." Kos-
