

# Henry Aldrich Is Plagued By New Troubles With Gal

## Youth Has Hard Time Winning Bobsled Race Without Sled; Drama Set On Cavalcade Program

Henry Aldrich finds it tough sledding to win a bob-sled race without a sled in the broadcast of "The Aldrich Family," starring Ezra Stone, over WJZ Tuesday at 8:00 p. m.

If he hadn't suspected that the favors of a certain red-headed girl were in one way or another reflected in the matter, Henry might have hesitated, under the circumstances, in accepting his rival's challenge to a race.

The story of Mehitabel Wing, young Hudson Valley woman who made a journey on horseback 170 years ago which makes pale the much-heralded ride of Paul Revere, will be dramatized as the third chapter in the current series of Cavalcade of America broadcasts Tuesday at 9 p. m. over WJZ.

Mehitabel lived at Poughkeepsie in a time when Hudson Valley farmers were cruelly oppressed by the English. Mehitabel, whose husband was sentenced to death, galloped alone 70 miles thru the night to New York to secure a stay of sentence from the governor. The next day she rode back, arriving at a time critical not only for her husband but for his fellow farmers.

Jeanette Nolan, who will be starred as Mehitabel, is widely known in radio as a girl of many voices. In 1934 she was a permanent member of Mary Pickford's supporting cast in that star's first radio series, and later was heard with the March of Time and the Cavalcade of America.

Elsa Lancaster, English stage and screen star, and wife of Charles Laughton, will be the guest of Edward Weeks, editor of the Atlantic Monthly, during the Meet Mr. Weeks program over WJZ Tuesday at 9:30 p. m. The discussion will revolve around those people in the professions — particularly those connected with the theatre — who have found time to write books.

Taking a culinary slice of life for his sermon, Tom Wallace, keeper of Uncle Walter's Dog House, will reveal in drama form how the beans were royally spilled in the Busby kitchen, thus bouncing Mr. Busby into the canine caravan serial during the Tuesday broadcast at 10:30 p. m. over WEAf. Musical highlights will include Virginia Verrill's vocal description of "The Wind at My Window" and Bob Strong's orchestral arrangements of "Stop, It's Wonderful," "Avalon" and a college medley salute to New Mexico, Washington university of St. Louis and Carnegie Tech.
