

Top Flight Stars Will Aid In March Of Dimes Program

Celebrated Artists To Be Heard From 11 To 12 Saturday Night With Cantor As Master Of Ceremonies

Top-flight names of screen and radio, turning their talent to aid of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis campaign, will present a brilliant full-hour variety show on Saturday over the coast-to-coast Red network of the NBC. This special broadcast, "The March of Dimes," will originate in Hollywood and will be heard from 11 to 12 p. m. Eddie Cantor, master-of-ceremonies for the star-studded program, in his capacity as chairman of the March of Dimes of the Air, will explain the purpose of the show. The raising of funds thru voluntary 10 cent contributions to fight infantile paralysis.

Among the celebrated artists already scheduled are Conline Boswell, Meredith Willson, Mickey Rooney, Bob Hope, Rudy Vallee, Burns and Allen, Frances Langford, Bob Burns, Frank Parker, Fanny Brice, Bing Crosby, Fibber McGee and Molly, Kenny Baker, Jack Benny, Mary Livingstone, Rochester and Sidney H. Fields.

Benny Ruben, erstwhile comedian of stage, screen and radio, appears at his own request in Arch Oboler's play, "The sensitive Mr. Ginsburg," which is to be presented over WEAF Saturday at 8 p. m. The story concerns a fight manager who finds that his sensitive soul interferes with business.

The true story of "Mother-in-law McGimsey" is the Old Ranger's yarn for the Death Valley Days broadcast Saturday, at 9:30 p. m., over WEAF. Mrs. McGimsey, living with her married daughter, assumes proprietorship of a filling station in the desert after her son-in-law abandons it as a failure. The old woman makes a success of the venture by persuading prospectors to add a lunch counter to the building in exchange for food and clothing.

Lucius Beebe, well-known New York columnist, will appear as guest gag-buster on Milton Berle's Stop Me If You've Heard This One program, Saturday at 8:30 p. m., over WEAF. Beebe's nightly prowlings in the theatre and night club districts amid elite society and quick-witted entertainers have given him a great store of jokes and anecdotes.

Twenty government inspectors were requested — but only Dale McLauren was sent. Yet this World war ace, alone and unaided, smashed a dangerous west coast narcotic's ring in a series of flights and daring detective work, the story of which will be dramatized on Sky Blazers, at 7:30 p. m. Saturday over WABC. McLauren's exploit will be told to Col. Roscoe Turner, master of ceremonies.

Sky Blazers will depict how McLauren flew alone to a desolate section near the Mexican border, where the traffic in narcotics seemed concentrated. A murdered man furnished the first clue on the smugglers. Immediately McLauren's observations led him to their hangout. He captured several of the desperados in a single-handed feat which the government narcotics chief on the west coast estimated would take 20 men.

While flying back to his office with vital evidence involving other members of the ring, McLauren discovered that another plane was following him. Because it was speedier and more modern, its pilot was able to get into position for a death fight with McLauren. In a thrilling climactic sequence, Sky Blazers will tell how McLauren's defiant, well-executed maneuvers bested the smuggler and led to the subsequent capture of the narcotic ring leader.
