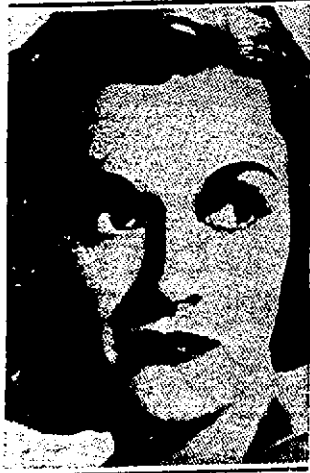


Outstanding Man of '39 Award Presentation on Air Tonight at 9
