Red Cross Relief Drama, Observers' Talks on Air Tonight



Basil Rathbone, star of the "Sherlock Holmes" programs, heard over the NBC-Blue network and WLS on Wednesdays, has really landed as the famed Baker Street sleuth. A dramatization of American Red Cross war relief operations in Europe, climaxed by an interview featuring two war observers recently returned to this country, will be broadcast at 8:30 tonight through WMAQ.

The program will feature Ernest J. Swift, Red Cross vice-chairman who returned last month from a survey of relief needs; he will be interviewed by H. R. Baukhage, foreign affairs expert of the National Broadcasting co., who covered the early days of the war in Europe.
