"Arrah-na-Pogue," Dion Boucicault's thrilling drama about revolutionary Ireland which called down upon him the wrath of Queen Victoria because it revived an almost forgotten street balad—"The Wearing of the Green"—will be the Great Play produced over WJZ Sunday at 2:00 p. m. It was at the London premiere on March 22, 1865, that serious trouble developed when Boucicault stepped to the footlights and, in the presence of various British cabinet ministers, sang "The Wearing of the Green." The very next morning Queen Victoria issued an edict banning the song in Great Britain and the Dominions.
