

Richard Crooks Returns To Air After Week's Absence

Kostelanetz To Highlight New Chorus With Two Numbers; Musical Trip To Orient Listed

Richard Crooks, tenor star, will return to the air on Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ after a week's absence. Crooks will sing "Life and Death" by Coleridge-Taylor; Lalo's "Aubade," "My Message" by d'Hardelot and Herbert's "Moonbeams." The Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Alfred Wallenstein, will play Luigini's "Ballet Egyptian," "Turkey in the Straw" by Steiner and Strauss' "Voices of Spring."

Andie Kostelanetz will highlight "Tune-Up Time's" new chorus in two interesting numbers Monday. The first will be a nostalgic medley entitled "Songs of Yesterday" which includes some of the loveliest and most tuneful ballads of the last two decades. The songs are "Memories," "Japanese Sandman," "Marcheta," "I Want To Be Happy" and "Whispering." The second choral number will be a first performance of the air of "Someday You'll Find Your Bluebird" from the new technicolor film, Maeterlinck's "The Blue Bird." Shirley Temple, who is featured in the movie version of the classic fantasy, has wired Kostelanetz that she will be listening to this first broadcast of her favorite song from the picture.

Opal Craven, the Lullaby Lady, the Continentals Quartet and Josef A. Pasternack's orchestra will take a musical trip to the Orient on Monday during the Contented program at 10:00 p. m. over WEAJ. Two selections from Norton's "Chu Chin Chow," "March of the Thieves" and "Serenade," will open the program. Also to be heard are excerpts from Rimsky-Korsakoff's "Scheherazade," "Baby of Hindustan" by Kempinski, Piusoli's "Bedouin Love Song," Tschai-kowsky's "Arabian Dance" and a group of Arabian folksongs.
