

Hoover Heads Tonight's Guest List, Speaks For Finn Relief Fund

Herbert Clark Hoover, 31st president of the United States, will share guestar honors with Raymond Scott, young American composer, in Gabriel Heatter's "We, the People" broadcast at 8 tonight on WBBM.
