

Louis - Godoy Title Scrap To Be Broadcast Friday Night

Heavyweight Battle Will Hit Airwaves At 10 P. M. With Sam Taub And Bill Stern Describing Encounter

Joe Louis 15-round defense of his world's heavyweight crown against Arturo Godoy, at Madison Square Garden on Friday, will be described over the nationwide WJZ network beginning at 10:00 p. m. The encounter will be described in detail by Sam Taub and Bill Stern.

Barry Fitzgerald and Sara Allgood, members of the original Abbey Players who presented Shean O'Casey's "Juno and the Paycock" in Dublin in 1924, will broadcast scenes from its current Broadway revival on the 'Kate Smith Hour' Friday at 8:00 p. m., over WABC.

In the musical portion of the program Ted Collins will introduce Kate Smith in such popular hits as "All the Things You Are," "This Changing World" and "Wind At My Window." The Ted Straeter Singers will offer a unique rhythm arrangement of "Smarty Pants." Abbott and Costello, Parker Fennelly and Arthur Allen in a "Snow Village Sketch" and Jack Miller's music will round out the program of song, drama and comedy.

"The Fatal Error," starring those forceful character, Inspector Ross and Step-Down Donovan, is Max Marcin's "Perfect Crime" dramatization on "Johnny Presents" over WABC Friday at 9 p. m. Music, conducted by Johnny Green, includes "To You Sweetheart, Aloha," "I'm Sorry Dear," "Holy Smoke," "Careless" and "I've Got My Eyes On You."

The Electronic Orchestra, which last year made musical history on the air by pioneering the electronic music, will again make music with molecules on Friday in a return engagement over WFAF at 10:00 p. m.

The orchestra, now with several new instruments and an increased personnel, will again be under the baton of Andre Monier, well-known dance band conductor. Gwen Williams, NBC star, will handle vocal assignments, and orchestral numbers will be played by the augmented band which includes William Schumann cello virtuoso who also is expert on six other instruments.

Miscellaneous and sundry . . . Rudy Vallee will return to the air-planes wit' a program early in March. The program will be broadcast at 9:30 p. m. Thursdays, using the last half-hour that is now part of the Good News of 1940 hour. Vallee, who broadcast for 10 years for one sponsor, is responsible for the uncovering of the radio talents of Bergen and McCarthy, Bob Burns, Alice Faye, Joe Penner, Frances Langford, Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou and many others.
