

Massey To Do New Lincoln Interpretation On Tuesday

Theatres Foremost Exponent Of Character Of Great Emancipator Set On Cavalcade Program

Raymond Massey, nationally recognized as the theatre's foremost interpreter of the Lincoln character, will enact the wartorn years of Lincoln's presidency during a special radio presentation of the Cavalcade of America Tuesday from 9 to 9:30 p. m. over WJZ.

The original radio drama, written especially for the broadcast by Robert E. Sherwood, is based entirely on material from Carl Sandburg's biography, "Lincoln: The War Years." The broadcast will be staged visually in the Chicago Civic Opera House for an audience of 3500 people.

Paul Gallico, who gave up a brilliant career as a newspaper sports writer to become equally famous as the author of innumerable short stories and novels, will be the guest of Edward Weeks, editor of the Atlantic Monthly, during the "Meet Mr. Weeks" program over WJZ at 9:30 p. m. Tuesday.
