

Templeton Will Be Heard As National Barn Dance Guest

Wizard Of The Ivories To Join Show At 9 P. M. Saturday; Gang Busters To Do Special Feature

Alec Templeton, wizard of the ivories, will bring his piano to the National Barn Dance, as guest on the bayloft program, Saturday, at 9:00 p. m., over WJZ.

During the program Alec will join the Hoosier Hot Shots, instrumental and vocal quartet, in a special arrangement of "Tiger Rag", and will be heard with the ensemble in "Liebestraum". Other talent includes Blues Singer Jane Kaye, Tenor Henry Burr, Eddie Peabody, banjoist, Pick and Pat, blackface comedians, and Glenn Welby and his orchestra, Joe Kelly, the Arkansas Woodchopper, will enceed.
