

# Brilliant Array Of Stars Set On Screen Guild Show

Cagney, Lynn And Olivia de Havilland To Be Featured In Dramatic "Dynamite" Over WABC, Sunday Night

James Cagney, Jeffrey Lynn and Olivia de Havilland join Roger Pryor, Oscar Bradley and John Conte to headline the Screen Guild Theatre Sunday, over WABC at 7:30 p. m.

They will be featured in Jeanie McPherson's dramatic play, "Dynamite", the story of a spoiled and pampered society girl who marries a condemned murderer because her legacy states she must be married by a certain age to fall heir to her father's huge estate. Complications occur when the murderer is discovered to be an innocent man and is released after the marriage takes place in prison.

The third and final chapter in Jack Benny's account of his winter vacation at Yosemite National Park with Mary Livingstone, Phil Harris, Dennis Day, Don Wilson and Rochester will highlight the comedian's broadcast over WABC Sunday, at 7 p. m.

The Kentucky blue grass country, in the lavish days when families would serve a meal starting at 8 o'clock and continuing well past midnight, will be the locale of "This Land of Ours" broadcast over WLW, Sunday at 10:30 p. m.

The script deals with the Preston homestead at Lexington, Ky., originally known as Glendower and now used as a nurses' home for St. Joseph hospital. In the 1870's it was famous as the scene of some of the most fabulous hospitality in central Kentucky, with meals including two consommés, a choice of two fish, venison and squab, six or seven entrees, two roasts and a dozen other dishes, all on a gold service.

The distinguished American baritone, John Charles Thomas, will make his third appearance on the current Sunday Evening Hour series. He will be heard with the 75-piece Ford Symphony Orchestra and mixed chorus over WJR from 9 to 10 p. m.

In concluding his portion of the broadcast, Mr. Thomas, the orchestra and chorus, will present a special arrangement of the Jerome Kern classic, "Old Man River" from "Show Boat."
