

Rudy Vallee Goes Dramatic For Radio Theatre Monday

Veteran Of Air Waves To Play Opposite Virginia Bruce In "Swing High, Swing Low" Over WABC At 9 P. M.

Radio veteran Rudy Vallee will go dramatic when he makes his debut on the Radio theatre Monday, opposite Virginia Bruce in "Swing High, Swing Low." Cecil B. DeMille handles the production reins for the broadcast over WABC at 9:00 p. m.

This will mark Vallee's last radio appearance until he becomes master of ceremonies of a new hour early in March. In the meantime, he has been learning the art of producing motion pictures on the Republic lot in Hollywood.

Beautiful Dorothy Lamour of sarong, song and screen fame, will be "Tune-Up Time's" guest star on Monday at 8 p. m. over WABC. The glamorous brown-haired, blue-eyed, New Orleans girl will sing two songs from her soon-to-be-released Paramount picture, "The Road to Singapore."

With the chorus, she will first be heard in "The Moon and The Willow Tree." Her second number will be a duet with Tony Martin, which is titled "Too Romantic," also from the new picture.

Richard Crooks, tenor soloist on the Voice of Firestone concert, Monday at 8:30 p. m., over WEAf, will sing Cadman's "At Dawning," "To the Children" by Rachmaninoff, Foster's "Jeanie with the Light Brown Hair," and the traditional "Ay, Ay, Ay." The Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Alfred Wallenstein will play the Overture to "Orpheus" by Offenbach, Gounod's "Faust" Waltz and Brahms' Hungarian Dance No. 6.

Philip Manuel and Gavin Williamson, duo harpsichordists, will appear as guests of Alec Templeton, Monday, at 9:30 over WEAf. Another Lancastershire tale by Pat O'Malley and selections by Daniel Saidenberg's orchestra and William Miller's chorus round out the show.

Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou will present Mary Alcott, pretty bluesinger from Cincinnati, as guest soloist Monday at 8:00 p. m., over WEAf.

Earl Tanner and Robert Spencer, tenors of the Continentals Quartet, will sing Tito Schipa's "El Gaucho" during the Carnation Contented program's salute to Chile, Monday, at 10:00 p. m., over WEAf. The Carnation Chorus and orchestra, conducted by Josef A. Pasternack, will be heard in "O Ya Ya". Orchestral numbers include "Valparaiso" and "Danza Chillean Yestilo". Lullaby Lady Opal will sing "Do Do as her Chilean cradle song."
