Errol Flynn, Joan Bennett, Claire Trevor and Ralph Bellamy are starred in the DeMille Radio theatre production of "Trade Winds," which will be broadcast over WABC at 9 p. m. Miss Bennett, currently starred in the Sigma theatre's "The Housekeeper's Daughter," and Bellamy are from the motion picture cast. Mystery, excitement, adventure, romance and trickery are the ingredients of the clever story of the detective who chased a fugitive around the world only to find her and fall in love.
