

# John Garfield To Star In Cavalcade Of America Show

"The Kidnaped General" Will Be Vehicle For  
Young Film Player; Famous "Blues" Com-  
poser To Be Heard

John Garfield, young star of stage and screen, will have the lead in a drama based on a humorous and little-known incident of American history. "The Kidnaped General," to be broadcast by "Cavalcade of America" over WJZ Tuesday from 9:00 to 9:30 p. m.

The air drama, based on material from a story by Marquis James, will present Garfield as William Barton, daring young Rhode Island lieutenant, who celebrated the Fourth of July in 1777 by kidnapping a British Brigadier General.

Under cover of Whale-boat races, Lieutenant Barton snatched the effete general from his bed, minus breeches, perriwig and dignity and took him to Providence as a hostage.

W. C. Handy, famous Negro composer of the "St. Louis Blues" and other "blues" songs, will make one of his rare public appearance when he is heard on Gabriel Heatter's "We, The People" Tuesday, at 9:00 p. m., over WABC.

Other guests who will tell of unusual experiences are Norman Trentacosta, nine-year-old boy from New Orleans, who was saved from drowning by a playmate; Dr. Arthur S. Jones, of Huntington, West Va., who heads one of the most modern hospitals in the South due to a grateful patient, and Alex Brennan, of Denver, Col., who will explain how an operation made it possible for him to see his twenty-nine-year-old son for the first time.
