

# Carroll And Aherne Will Dramatize Famous Novel

## Tommy Riggs And Betty Lou To Present "The Little Princess Of Song;" Holmes' Series To End

A best-selling novel, "My Son, My Son," by Howard Spring will be dramatized by the Radio Theatre Monday, with Madeleine Carroll, Brian Aherne, Louis Hayward, and Josephine Hutchinson in the leading roles at 9 p. m. over WABC. This is the same cast that appears in the picture which is scheduled to be released late this month.

Tschaikowsky's "None But the Lonely Heart" will be sung by Richard Crooks as a feature Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEA. Crooks also will sing "Blue are Her Eyes" by Watts, Rimsky-Korsakoff's "Song of India," and "Within the Garden of My Heart" by Scott. The Firestone Symphony, under the direction of Alfred Wallenstein, will open the program with the Overture to "The Secret of Suzanne" by Wolf-Ferrari, and will play Lehar's "Merry Widow" waltzes, and the Sailors' Dance from "The Red Poppy" by Gliere.

Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou will present Sylvia Froos, the "little princess of song," as their guest singer Monday, at 8:00 p. m., over WEA. Her appearance next week will mark the singer's second visit this year to the show.

Sherlock Holmes's unrelenting battle with the arch criminal Professor Moriarty reaches a climax in "The Final Problem," concluding broadcast in the winter series of "Adventures of Sherlock Holmes" to be heard Monday at 8:00 p. m., over WJZ.

Actors will vie with actresses on the "True or False" quiz, Monday at 8:30 p. m., over WJZ, men from the cast of "The Man Who Came to Dinner," actresses playing in "Abe Lincoln in Illinois." Dr. Harry Hagen, quiz-conductor, will referee the contest to be held in the Civic Opera House.

Two outstanding features highlight the Andre Kostelanetz "Tune-Up Time" program over WABC Monday, at 8 p. m., when the conductor offers the first radio presentation of the latest Rodgers and Hart music from the new Broadway show, "Higher and Higher," and accompanies Tony Martin in his version of "Isle of May," latest composition by Kostelanetz. The medley from "Higher and Higher" includes "Life and Liberty and Pursuit of You," "Nothing But You," "Every Sunday Afternoon" and "From Another World." As an additional treat, Kostelanetz has made a special arrangement of "Limehouse Blues."

A musical journey to the Emerald Isle will feature the broadcast by Josef A. Pasternack and the Contented cast, Monday over WEA. The orchestra and ensemble will open the program with "The Irish Have a Great Day Tonight," by Herbert. "The Minstrel Boy" and Balfe's "Killar-

eny." "My Wild Irish Rose" will be a tenor solo with chorus and orchestra. Opal Craven, the Lullaby Lady, will sing "Too-Ra-Loo-Ra" with harp accompaniment and the Continentals Quartet "The Garden Where the Praties Grow."

Sammy Kaye, maestro of NBC's popular "Sensations and Swing" series, will salute the girls in a medley of old favorites during the broadcast Monday at 7:30 p. m., over WEA. The medley includes "A Pretty Girl Is Just Like a Melody," "Dear Old Girl" and "I Want a Girl."
