

Legion's 21st Anniversary Program Will Be Aired

Crosby Will Offer Salute To St. Patrick's Day; Gang Busters Present Another Thrilling Episode

The American Legion's 21st birthday party—a full-hour program featuring Legion officials and a dramatic sketch—will be brought to radio listeners on Saturday over WJZ.

The broadcast, to be heard from 7:30 to 8:30 p. m., has been arranged in connection with local parties of posts and units of the Legion and its Auxiliary throught the country.

Raymond J. Kelly, national commander, speaking from Chicago, and Mrs. William J. Corwith, national president of the Auxiliary, speaking from the studios in New York, will be heard.

The dramatization has been planned as a review of Legion activities since 1919, and will highlight important phases of the organization's history.

Bob Crosby's band will open with "It Had To Be You," on the weekly program Saturday at 10 p. m. over WEAF. Mildred Bailey will sing "Danny Boy." The Crosby band will salute St. Patrick's Day by playing "Old County Down." This will be followed by "Starlit Hour," and "Sweet Potato Piper," which will be chanted by Bob Crosby. Mildred Bailey's rendition of "Isle of May" taken from Tchaikowsky's Andante Cantabile has proven so popular she will sing it again and the band will close with "That's A-Plenty."
