

# "The Rains Came" Scheduled On Radio Theatre Monday

George Brent, Kay Francis, Jean Parker And Jim Ameche To Take Lead Roles Over WABC At 9 P. M.

The third successive four star production in the Radio Theatre is "The Rains Came" which features George Brent, Kay Francis, Jean Parker, and Jim Ameche on Monday over WABC at 9:00 p. m. Based on the screenplay that was taken from Louis Bromfield's successful novel on India, "The Rains Came" will have George Brent in the lead role of Tom Ransome.

Andre Kostelanetz spotlights a medley of Gypsy Airs by Kalman as a feature of his "Tune-Up Time" program Monday over WABC at 8 p. m. The conductor has made special arrangements of four songs, "The Sari Waltz," "Will You Forget?" "Czardas" and "Play Gypsies." He will also accompany Tony Martin in "Too Romantic" and the chorus in a medley of old-fashioned rounds.

Richard Crooks will sing "King Ever Glorious" from Stainer's "Crucifixion," during the concert, Monday at 8:30 p. m., over WEAf. Crooks also will sing "Ah! May the Red Rose Bloom Always" by Foster, Purcell's "Passing By" and Schubert's "Ave Maria." The Firestone Symphony, conducted by Alfred Wallenstein, will be heard in the March from Wagner's "Tannhauser," Infante's "Ritmo" and "Irish Washerwoman" by Sowerby.

Berlioz' "Roman Carnival" overture will open the concert by the Rochester Civic orchestra, Monday, March 18, at 9:30 p. m., over WJZ. Guy Fraser Harrison also will conduct Grainger's arrangement of "Londonderry Air" and Victor Herbert's "Irish Rhapsody."

Lovely Joan Edwards, singing star of Paul Whiteman's band, will be the guest Monday, at 8 p. m., over WEAf, when the Tommy Riggs and Betty Lou program is broadcast. Joan, currently on tour with Pops Whiteman, will fly in to New York from Indianapolis where she's with the Whiteman crew at the Lyric theatre.

The eyes have it, and as a result Sammy Kaye, maestro of "Sensations and Swing" series, will dedicate his evening's medley to them Monday, at 7:30 p. m., over WEAf. The offering includes "Dark Eyes," "When Irish Eyes Are Smiling" and "Ma, She's Making Eyes At Me." The versatile Vass Family also will be heard.

Portugal will be the next port of call for Carnation Contented "International Nights," when Josef Pasternack and the Contented crew drop anchor for the program, Monday at 10 p. m., over WEAf. The Continentals chorus will be featured with the orchestra in two medleys, one of five folk tunes, the other of typical Portuguese marches. Basso Reinhold Schmidt will sing "Beijos de Amour" by Sarti, and the cradle song "Papae Curumiassie" will be sung by Lullaby Lady Opal Craven. Also programmed are the March from Meyerbeer's "L'Africaine" and "O Burric" (The Clams) sung by the Continentals.

A performance of Bach's cantata, "Jesu, Priceless Treasure," will be given by the Northwestern university A Cappella Choir of 65 voices under George Howerton, over WJZ Monday, from 8 to 8:30 p. m., as a special Easter week feature.
