

Pilot Harold Dahl To Tell Of Experiences As Fighter

Loyalist Flier Will Be Heard On "We, The People" Tuesday; Heidt Show Set In Chicago

Harold E. Dahl, American who flew in Spain for the Loyalists, and who has just been pardoned by General Franco, will head the list of guests on Gabriel Heatter's "We, the People" program Tuesday at 9 p. m. over WABC.

Dahl was released from prison largely thru the efforts of his wife, Edith, who wrote to General Franco sending him a picture of herself. Mrs. Dahl appeared on the program herself several months ago to tell the story of her efforts to free her husband.

"Remember the Alamo," famous rallying cry used by General Sam Houston to bring his retreating forces into a solid mass of fighting men to conquer the guerilla's of Santa Anna and win independence for Texas, is the keynote of the Rush Hughes "Hughesreel" describing the "Birth of the Lone Star State."
