

Gang Busters To Tell How Two Killers Met Their End

Gun-Crazy Easton Brothers Slew With Impunity; Bob Crosby To Do Fine Hit Program

How two silver dollars actually cost the lives of a police officer and a pair of gun-crazy North Dakota killers will be told on Gang Busters when the career of Clarence and Orville Easton is reviewed by Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf and an officer connected with the case Saturday over WABC at 8 p. m.

The Easton brothers were small town gunmen who wanted to break into the big money, but never actually gained more than two silver dollars by the brutal tactics. During their maraudings in 1938, the Eastons emptied a full chamber of lead into an unsuspecting police officer and kidnaped two deputies to hold as hostages, beside firing occasional broadsides into passing cars without provocation. They topped all this by kidnaping a man and his child.

During a police chase in Illinois, the Eastons amazed law enforcement officers, who were following in an armor-plated car, by shattering supposedly bullet-proof glass. This they did by hitting the same spot on the windshield with four bullets in succession.

The capture by seaplane of a giant orang-utan that was terrorizing native villages in the heart of the Borneo jungle will be dramatized Saturday at 7:30 p. m., over WABC when the Sky Blazers program presents the second and concluding installment of Jim Laneri's adventures as aviator for Martin Johnson's 1935-37 expedition.

Laneri's problem was complicated because Martin Johnson requested that the killer-ape be taken alive and unhurt. How Laneri made the capture possible by breathtaking flying exploits, and how he flew the orang-utan back to the coast will be told by Col. Roscoe Turner, speed ace, who is master-of-ceremonies on the program.

Bob Crosby's band will feature "Tuxedo Junction" with Mildred Bailey handling the vocals on the weekly program, Saturday at 10:00 p. m., over WEAJ. Other numbers by the band will be "I've Got My Eyes On You!" "Skater's Waltz" and Nick Kenny's "Leavin' On The Ole Top Rail" with vocals by Bob Crosby. Irving Pazzola, clarinetist, will be featured in "My Inspiration." Mildred Bailey's closing number will be "I'll Never Be The Same."

Roy Acuff and his Smoky Mountainer Boys open up the "Grand Ole Opry" program on Saturday at 8:30 p. m., WEAJ, with the good old fashioned square dance number "Whoop 'Em Up Cindy." Roy's song of the week will be "My Pal of Yesterday." A trio from the hills of Tennessee, the McGee Brothers, will play the "Fox Chase" and "Leather Britches."

Commemorating the 100th anniversary of the birth of Peter Ilyich Tchaikowsky, Arturo Toscanini has selected an all-Tchaikowsky program for his Symphony concert, Saturday at 10:00 p. m., over WJZ.

The program will open with Tchaikowsky's Symphony No. 6, in B Minor (the Pathetic), and will include the "Nutcracker" Suite and the "Romeo and Juliet" Overture-Fantasia.

Newspaper photographers in New York and Paris will discuss picture coverage of the European war, exchange ideas and suggestions, and incidentally, beat the drums for the annual Press Photographers' Ball, Saturday, in a two-way broadcast from 8:00 to 8:10 p. m., over WJZ.

From New York, Pat Candido and Walter Ranzini of the New York Daily News, and Robert Wands of the New York Times, will speak to a group of American cameramen in Paris who have been covering the hostilities.
