

Alec Templeton Will Bid Hollywood Farewell

Six William And Mary Co-eds To Face Cary Grant, Film Star, On Quiz Program

Alec Templeton's farewell to Hollywood during his broadcast Monday at 9 p. m. over WEAF, will be marked by the guest appearance of the famous St. Brendan's Boys choir directed by Bob Mitchell. Pat O'Malley, chronicler of far-fetched Lancashire happenings, will tell the story of what happens when "Herbert Pinwinkle Tells the Truth."

Six co-eds of William and Mary college will face Cary Grant, tall hero of the films, on the "True or False" quiz to be held in Williamsburg, Va., Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ. The Hollywood heartwinger will captain a team of men picked from those producing the picture, "Tree of Liberty," among them Sir Cedric Hardwicke.

Maestro Josef A. Pasternack and his contented crew will heave to in the Mediterranean during the broadcast Monday, at 10:00 p. m., over WEAF. Pasternack will conduct a salute to Egypt in the form of the ballet music from Verdi's "Aida," two Spanish selections by Alvarez, and Evan's "Lady of Spain." Two Peirne works from "Cydalise," will represent the French Riviera, and Opal Craven will sing the traditional Greek "Ainte, Ainte, Koimesoy," while the Continentals offer two Italian works.

Margaret Speaks will sing "Kreisler's "The Whole World Knows" as her first solo Monday, at 8:30 p. m., over WEAF. Miss Speaks also will sing "Some Day, Some Way" by Crist. Bizet's "Ouvre ton Coeur," and "My Hero" from Strauss' "Chocolate Soldier." The orchestra under the direction of Alfred Wallenstein will play Berlioz' "Marche Hongroise," "Wiener Blut" and Johann Strauss, and Dvorak's Slavonic Dance No. 8 in E Minor.

Fibber McGee and Molly will be starred on the Radio Theatre Monday at 9 p. m. over WABC. The popular citizens of Wistful Vista will appear in "Momma Loves Papa," with Cecil B. DeMille directing.

Lanny Ross will feature the "Missouri Waltz" as his memory song in the new evening program at 7:15 p. m. Monday over WABC. Ross will be heard at the same time Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, each week.

The Doctor I. Q. quiz program will originate from the Palace theatre in Dallas, Monday, at 9:00 p. m. over WEAF. Dallas is the eighth city in which Dr. I. Q. has conducted his tests among movie-
