Bob Hope, in the role of census taker, will burlesque the trials and tribulations of Uncle Sam's population enumerators, Tuesday at 10:00 p. m., over WEAF, with the assistance of Bill Goodwin and Skinnay Ennis. Counted in every census since Jackson was president, Brenda and Cobina, will be prime examples.

Drawing steadily closer to New York, Horace Heidt and his show will originate from the studios of WTAM, Cleveland, Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. According to present plans the gang returns to New York on April 30 for an indefinite stay.
