Mrs. MacDowell, now 81 years old, will tell how she is still carrying on the famous art colony at Peterboro, N. M. she founded in 1908 in memory of her husband. The colony has been the home of 11 Pulitzer Prize winners. The late Elinor Wylie wrote some of her best poems there.

Jim and Marian Jordan will celebrate their fifth anniversary as the Fibber McGee and Molly of WEAf on Tuesday, at 9:30 p. m. The famous comedy team, whose program critics placed among the top 10 in radio this year, will present a special program to mark their milestone. Fibber and Molly, the long-suffering spouse, were first introduced to radio audiences in 1935.

A chapter from the life of Daniel Boone, American frontiersman, will be dramatized on "Cavalcade of America," Tuesday from 9 to 9:30 p. m. over WJZ. John McIntyre, well-known radio actor, will be starred in the title role.

When America moved West, Daniel Boone led America. Behind him, in 1777 there were 13 colonies hemmed in by mountains. When he died in Missouri in 1820, at 86, there were 23 states in the union, eight of them west of the Alleghenies. Boone claimed never to have been lost in his wanderings, but admitted that he was bewildered once for three days.

"His Last Stand" or "Hamburgers Deluxe," story of a whirlwind summer courtship, will be unfolded by Uncle Walter during his Dog House program, Tuesday, at 10:30 p. m. Ignace Jan Paderewski, most famous living pianist, and former Prime Minister of Poland, will address radio listeners in America on Tuesday, for the first time since he assumed presidency of the council of the Polish government in exile.
