

Stirring Tales To Be Told On Two Programs Saturday

"Sky Blazers" And "Gang Busters" Promise Action; Roosevelt To Address Young Democratic Clubs

An unknown killer stalked the north country in 1931, spreading terror among trappers and eskimos with his death-leading claws until wartime flier Wilfred May brought his airplane-on-skis into the search for the fiendish man-beast. How pilot May's plane, a caribou stampede and a posse of Canadian Northwest Police finally trapped this dangerous killer of the Arctic circle will be told by Col. Roscoe Turner, master-of-ceremonies, on Sky Blazers, Saturday at 1:30 p. m. over WABC.

The story of how an organization called Boys' Haven transformed the once-notorious Sixth Ward of Allentown, Pa., from a breeding place of criminals to one of the most respectable districts of the city will be told on Gang Busters, Saturday at 8 p. m. over WABC.

Robert Rhedans, former newspaperman and founder-director of Boys' Haven, will trace the ever-increasing success of his institution in stamping out juvenile delinquency when he is interviewed on the program by Col. H. Norman Schwarzkopf.

The Old Ranger will tell the story of the "Biggest Wagons in the World," the 20-mule team buggies used to haul borax out of the desert, during the "Death Valley Days" broadcast Saturday at 9:30 p. m. over WEAF.

President Roosevelt, addressing dinner meetings of the Young Democratic Clubs of America being held throughout the nation on Saturday, will be heard over WEAF at 10:45 p. m. Speaking from the White House, the President will be introduced by Homer M. Adams, president of the Young Democratic clubs, who will be attending the dinner at the Willard hotel. The President's talk is scheduled to last 15 minutes.

With the Prairie Ramblers, vocal and instrumental cowboy quartet, and Pat Buttram, pride of Winston-s.o. Alt., as guests, the National Barn Dance troupe will meander down musical sideroads on their broadcast Saturday at 9 p. m. over WJZ. Song stops will include "Buffalo Gals," by Arkie; "Asleep in the Deep," by Basso Joe Parsons; and "Sweet Georgia Brown," by the Hoosier Hot Shots and Ann, Pat and Judy.

First major crew clash of the season — the annual Washington-California four mile event — will be broadcast over WJZ Saturday from 7:30 to 8:00 p. m.

The race brings together two of the nation's outstanding eights.

"The Flowers Are Not for You to Pick," one of the finest pieces of radio writing ever to come out of England, will be revived on the Landmarks of Radio Drama program over WEAF Saturday at 8:00 p. m. under the direction of Joseph S. Bell.

This wistful story of a young clergyman with an inferiority complex was written in 1931 by Tyrone Guthrie and had its American premiere two years later. Besides its purely dramatic interest, "The Flowers Are Not for You to Pick" is of historical importance because it is one of the very earliest examples of the use of the flashback technique on the air.
