

Phillip Merivale Will Do Cavalcade Of American Show

Eminent Actor To Portray Role Of General Lee;
Swing Fourteen Will Offer Song From
Stage Hit

Phillip Merivale, eminent actor, will appear in the Cavalcade of America air drama about the Confederacy's greatest general, Robert E. Lee, to be broadcast from Richmond, Va., Tuesday evening. The broadcast will be presented before an audience of almost 5,000 persons in the huge Shrine Mosque auditorium and heard over WJZ and WEAf.

Based on episodes from Dr. Douglas S. Freeman's biography, "R. E. Lee," the air drama will emphasize the personal nobility and moral courage of Lee rather than his military genius. Several of Cavalcade's regular cast will participate in the program.

The other players will be local Richmond actors, who have been associated with the Richmond Theatre Guild and who have had previous radio experience. Don Vorhees, musical director of Cavalcade programs, will assemble an orchestra for the broadcast made up of local musicians.

"Friendship," hit comedy song from "DuBarry Was a Lady," will be repeated by the Swing Fourteen — in response to hundreds of requests — on the "Johnny Presents" program Tuesday at 8 p. m., over WEAf. Genevieve Rowe's solo is to be "The Sky Fell Down" and an orchestral feature will be "The Chocolate Soldier" medley including "Marching Song" and "My Hero." Rush Hughes plans to dramatize "Reaching for a Railroad Record" as his "Hughesreel."

Henry Aldrich's lawyer father manages to postpone a trial in "The Aldrich Family," starring Ezra Stone, over WJZ Tuesday at 8:00 p. m.

Henry's pal Dizzy played by Eddie Bracken who has just returned from Hollywood, will return to the cast. Harry Von Zell is narrator, and theme music will be played by the Jack Miller orchestra.

Thrilling story of the battle between two great railroads to achieve a speed record is planned by Rush Hughes for his "Hughesreel" story of April 23 on "Johnny Presents." Under the title, "Reaching for a Railroad Record," Rush will tell and dramatize the story of how the iron horses finally topped the 63-mile-per-hour record which stood for many years. Hughes is co-featured on "Johnny Presents" each Tuesday at 8 p. m. on WEAf with Johnny Green's orchestra, the Swing Fourteen and Johnny the Call Boy.

Major George Fielding Eliot will have to face both military and miscellaneous questions when Information Please goes on the air over WJZ Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. The military expert, author and lecturer, and Deems Taylor, musical critic and composer, will be guest experts with the regulars.
