The president will address dinner meetings of Young Democratic clubs at 9:45, and will be heard through WMAQ, WBBM, WGN, and other stations on the three major networks. Dewey's speech in the Hollywood bowl will be aired by WBBM and other Columbia network stations at 9:15.

Former stars of WLS will join Roy Rogers, western movie actor, and present artists at the Chicago station in tonight's birthday party. Rogers, Tony Wons, and Bradley Kincaid will appear on "The Last Hour" at 11 p. m. Kincaid also will take part in programs at 7:30 and 10:15 and Wons will appear at 9 and 10:30. The celebration will be on the air from 7 to midnight.
