Nazis Say Ship Sunk

Germans Claim Cruiser
Goes Down, Plane Car-
rier Damaged

BERLIN, May 25—(AP)—The German radio announced today in a special broadcast that Nazi warplanes had badly damaged a British aircraft carrier off the Norwegian coast, and sunk one cruiser and two supply ships.

In addition, the announcement said, an enemy battleship, which had been damaged earlier by two bomb hits, was struck again three times and put out of commission.

Another cruiser, two supply ships and a tanker were reported damaged.
