

"Porgy And Bess" Suite To Be Offered By Kostelanetz

Famous Gershwin Compositions May Be Heard At 7 P. M. Monday; Templeton Has Banjo King As Guest

Two medley arrangements by Kostelanetz will highlight the Monday program of "Tune-Up Time" at 7 p. m. over WABC. Conductor Kostelanetz and his 45-piece orchestra will introduce a summertime musical fare with a "Porgy and Bess" suite from the late George Gershwin's Broadway hit about Catfish Row in Charleston, including "It Ain't Necessarily So," "I've Got Plenty of Nothin'", and "Bess, You Is My Woman Now."

Eddie Peabody, American king of the banjo and unpteen other string instruments, will be featured with Alec Templeton in a premiere of "Prelude for Harp Guitar," a Templeton composition, when the banjo star is guest of Alec Templeton Time, Monday at 8:30 p. m. over WEAJ.

Margaret Speaks, soprano, will sing "Sylvia" written by her noted uncle, the American composer, Oley Speaks, during the program, Monday at 7:30 p. m., over WEAJ. Miss Speaks also will sing two

arias, the Meditation from Massenet's "Thais" and Connais-tu le Pays? from "Mignon" by Thomas, and Contes' "Bid Songs at Evening."

Portland, Oregon, "City of Roses," will receive a musical bouquet during the Carnation Contented program, Monday at 9 p. m. over WEAJ. The entire broadcast, directed by Roy Shield, will be dedicated to the northwest.
