## U. S. SCHOOLS TO TRAIN WORKERS

Instructions In Trades For National Defense Is Planned

WASHINGTON, June 10—(INS)—A comprehensive and well organized plan to train 1,250,000 skilled workers for trades essential to the national defense program was outlined today by Federal Security Administrator McNutt following conferences with representatives of major national educational organizations.

Vocational schools and engineering colleges are now training 500,000 youths and adults for the needed occupations and the trade schools could be expanded to more than double this figure in less than a year's time U. S. Commissioner of Education John W. Studebaker informed McNutt.

These schools, staffed by 35,000 trained and experienced teachers represent and investment of more than a billion and a quarter dol-
