Heavyweight Champion Joe Louis' forthcoming 15-round return bout with the Chilean challenger Arturo Godoy, to be held at the Yankee Stadium, Thursday will be described by Sam Taub and Ben Stern beginning at 9 p. m. over WJZ.

Roland Young, confused screen comedian, and Kirsten Flagstad, Met Opera star, will appear as guests of Bing Crosby during the Music Hall Thursday, 9 p. m. over WEAF.
