

Today's Radio Highlights

The Republican National Convention in Philadelphia will be the subject of many newscasts of the day, but the following are especially listed programs coming directly from the convention city:

10 A. M., WOL—Opening proceedings from the Philadelphia Auditorium.

4 P. M., WMAL AND WOL—Special event from Independence Hall with invocation by Bishop Francis Marion Tait; Richard Crooks, tenor, and the Orpheus Glee Club will sing and addresses will be delivered by Chairman John D. M. Hamilton and George Wharton Pepper.

9, WJSV, WMAL AND WRC—Gov. Harold E. Stassen of Minnesota, delivers the keynote address to the convention after Denis Cardinal Dougherty, of Philadelphia, has given the invocation.

11, WOL—Gov. Stassen's keynote speech and the accompanying ceremonies are rebroadcast by Mutual for those unable to hear the original airing two hours earlier.

OTHER EVENTS:

7, WJSV—Andre Kostelanetz concludes his well-liked "Tune Up Time" series with the hit songs introduced by that program during its year and a half on the air.

7:30, WRC—Margaret Speaks features selections from Jerome Kern's "Show Boat" and Rudolf Friml's "The Vagabond King" during her half-hour.

8, WJSV—"Show Boat" again! This time Irene Dunne, Charles Winninger and Allan Jones revive the great Kern musical in an hour's airing, each playing roles they have performed on both stage and screen.

8:30, WRC—The Chicago Philharmonic Orchestra plays in the Windy City's Grant Park.

8:30, WMAL—"Women as Librarians and Curators" are saluted by that Office of Education feature, Gallant American Women.
