

Today's Radio Highlights

Just how much longer the Republican National Convention will last no one knows. There will be the usual pick-ups from Philadelphia today, with WJSV promising two-minute reports every hour on the hour from noon through 4:02 p. m. WJSV also offers airings from the floor tonight from 9 to 9:30 and 10:15 to 10:35.

2:30 p. m. WJSV—Arch McDonald airs the Washington-Boston baseball game, lighting into his dugout chatter at 4 p. m.

6:30 P. M., WJSV—Harmonica harmonists, Ed and Tom Pfehal accompany Artie Auerbach and Al Pearce for another edition of "The Screwball Sun."

7. Abbott and Costello are on hand and Miss Smith again sings "The Lord Done Fixed Up My Soul," from Irving Berlin's "Louisiana Purchase." And, as a reminder, this is the last time this season to hear the buxom chanter in her smashing version of Berlin's "God Bless America."

7:30, WC—Alfred Wallenstein leads his Sinfonietta: "Abu Hassan" overture, von Weber; "Polonaise Arietta Passacalia," Handel; "Pavane," Ravel; "Kamarinskaya," Glinka.
