The chorus and orchestra will offer two famous marches, "Changing of the Guard" and "British Grenadiers." The quartet will sing the traditional "Drink To Me Only With Thine Eyes."

James Melton, tenor, will sing Jules Massenet's dream-like "Elegie" and Leoncavallo's joyous "Mattiati" on the "Telephone Hour" Monday at 7 p. m. over WEA F. He also will join Francia White, soprano, in a duet of Jerome Kern's "My Song."

"Birth of Passion" and "Every Little Movement," from Hoschna's "Madame Sherry," will be sung by Margaret Speaks on the Concert program at 7:30 p. m. Monday over WEA F. Other numbers

include the popular "Sally in Our Alley" and two selections from Strauss' "Waltz Dream."
