With the national political conventions a matter of history, radio will turn its attention tonight to national defense and inter-American policy.

Gen. James G. Harbord, addressing the annual reunion of the Second Division assn. of the American Expeditionary Force, will speak on "National Defense" at 8:30 through WMAQ. Harbord was chief of staff for the division during the World war.

Lt.-Commander George Chapline, expert on military planes, will speak on aviation's part in national defense during the Sky Blazers broadcast on WBBM at 8. The dramatic portion of this program will be devoted to the adventures of Theodore Waldeck, pilot who solved the mystery of Paul Redfern's disappearance in South American jungles.

Four or more delegates to the Inter-American conference at Havana will speak on "Is Pan-American Unity Possible?" during the People's Platform on WBBM at 9.
