

# Coast Guard Celebrates 150 Years of Service

The United States coast guard will round out 150 years of service today and for the occasion the National Broadcasting co. will stage a special broadcast from 12 to 12:30 p. m. WIBA and WMAQ, stemming in part from cutters plying the waters of both Atlantic and Pacific.

Best qualified to narrate the maritime saga of the Coast Guard are the men responsible for its exacting tasks. Consequently, NBC will bring to the microphone Rear Admiral R. R. Waesche, commander of the coast guard; Capt. Ralph W. Dempwolf, commander of the New York division; Capt. A. C. Park, member of the light house service, which recently was absorbed by the coast guard, and Commander Harold Berdine of the coast guard cutter "Spencer," assigned to weather patrol.

Short-wave will bring a pick-up from the "Spencer" on its patrol 1,500 miles off the Atlantic seaboard. Then, flashing to the south Pacific, the Cutter "Taney" will be heard on its remote run.

There will be a report from the Nantucket lightship, lonely guardian of the shipping lanes, and a demonstration from the Golden Gate life saving station in San Francisco harbor.
