Dr. Stock Directs Chicago Symphony on Three Stations Tonight

Dr. Frederick Stock will conduct the Chicago Symphony orchestra tonight in a concert which will broadcast from Chicago's Grant park. The program will be carried by WCFL from 7 to 8; by WENR from 8:15 to 9, and by WBBM from 8:30 to 9.

Music will include Mendelssohn's E-minor violin concerto, with Concertmaster John Weicher as soloist; Rachmaninoff's second symphony, Weber's "Euryanthe" overture, and Strauss' "Don Juan."
