Wendell L. Willkie's address accepting the Republican presidential nomination will be broadcast Saturday by WIBA, WMAQ, WENR, WBBM, WIND, and other stations.

In the program at 3 p. m., Rep. Charles A. Halleck (R., Ind.) will introduce Rep. Joseph W. Martin, Jr. (R., Mass.), who will make the notification speech. Willkie will follow Martin.
