

Quiz Program Moves To New York Theatre Stage

Artie Shaw And Orchestra To Feature Burns And Allen Show; Czech Conductor To Be Guest

Doctor I. Q. will shift the scene of his popular theatre audience participation broadcasts to the Capitol theatre in New York City beginning Monday at 9:00 p. m. over WEA. The weekly quiz sessions at present are heard from the Fox theatre, Billings, Mont.

New York is number eleven on the list of cities in which Doctor I. Q. has conducted his novel intelligence surveys among movie-goers. To date the broadcasts have originated in St. Louis, Chicago, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Denver, Boston, Hollywood, Dallas, Louisville and Billings.
