

# Wallace Notification Will Be On Air Thursday Evening

Rep. Marvin Jones Of Texas Will Make Speech; "Ting A Ling, A Ling," To Be Featured On Heidt Program

Rep. Marvin Jones of Texas will formally notify Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace of his nomination for vice president on Thursday. Rep. William Bankhead was originally announced to make the notification speech. The notification ceremonies, including Wallace's address of acceptance, will be heard from 9:15 to 10 p. m. over the NBC-Blue network, and from 9:30 to 10 p. m. over the NBC-Red network.
