Chief Laugh Provoker And His Cohorts Will Devote Their Program Time To Preparing Unusual Exhibits

With county fairs about to open thruout the country, Al Pearce and his comedy cohorts turn their attention to preparing their exhibits for the rural events as the theme of their weekly fun-fest over WJR Friday from 6:30 to 7 p. m.
