11 a. m., WMAL, WJSV and WOL—President Roosevelt makes the first of two Labor Day addresses. This first is at the dedication of Chickamauga Dam of the TVA.

3, WMAL—William Green of the A. F. of L. speaks on "Labor, Freedom and Democracy."

3 p. m., WJSV—Arthur Sweetser, former press director of the League of Nations, gives his views on possible post-war conditions.

3:30, WOL and WMAL—Running of the Aqueduct Handicap.

4, WMAL—John L. Lewis of the C. I. O. makes a Labor Day address.

4:30, WJSV—A. F. Whitney, president of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, addresses the third Constitutional Convention of the United Office and Professional Workers.

5, WJSV, WOL and WEC—President Roosevelt speaks at the dedication of the Great Smokey National Park.

6:15, WJSV—Senator James J. Davis, Pennsylvania Republican and former Secretary of Labor, discusses the general labor situation in the United States.

6:45, WMAL—I. M. Ornburn of the Union Label Trades Department, A. F. of L., discusses "Organized Labor and Defense."

7, WJSV—Secretary of Labor Frances Perkins reviews a year of labor conditions, her eighth Labor Day report as a member of President Roosevelt's Cabinet.

8, WJSV—Forecast offers a "Birth of a Nation" which has nothing to do with the great, early film. It concerns freedom of speech and Peter Zenger. Frank Craven, Burgess Meredith, Mary Astor, Gene Lockhart and Thomas Mitchell are the players.
