Sept. 3, 1939 marked the official declaration of war following the German invasion of Poland. Sept. 3, 1940—one year later—CBS and NBC calls its correspondents and news analysts from the vital nerve centers of the world for appraisal, retrospect, and forecast in special broadcasts marking this first, tragic anniversary of World War II.

The CBS broadcast will be heard through stations WBBM and WIND at 8:30 tonight. Besides the international hook-ups Commentators Elmer Davis and George Fielding Elliot will be heard.

The hour NBC program will be aired at 9 p. m. through WENR. Highlight of this broadcast will be the round-table discussion by H. V. Kaltenborn, John Gunther, John B. Kennedy, T. R. Ybarra, Earl Goodwin, Baukhage, Lowell Thomas, and Gen. S. O. Fuqua.
