London Newspaperwoman Joins Board Of "Information Please;" Musical Americana Plans Features

Captain Jack Knight, one of the original airmail pilots, will tell his experiences during his 1,500,000 miles of flying when he joins Gabriel Heatter's other guests on "We, The People," over WABC Tuesday at 8:00 p. m.

Irving "Schnitz" Davidson, "Mayor of Forty-Fourth Street" in New York City, will make his appearance postponed from last week. "Schnitz" specializes in putting on riots for swing bands. He and his 200 jitterburgs were busy at a New York dance hall putting on a "riot" when they should have been on "We, The People."

Alex Millbrooks, a 16-year-old Negro, will warn other boys not to steal rides on freight trains. He will tell how he held his two companions on top of a box-car for 85 miles, after one had been killed and the other seriously injured. They had been hit when the train passed thru a tunnel.
