**7, WJSV**—A new serial with a New England background: "Those We Love," with Nan Grey, Richard Cromwell and Donald Woods in the leading roles.

**8, WJSV**—"Love Is News," a film comedy, is radioed by the Lux Radio Theater with Bob Hope, Madeleine Carroll and Ralph Bellamy in the leads.

**9:15, WOL**—Who Knows? devotes itself to a dramatization of transmigration of souls.

**9:30, WMAL**—After the United States had won independence, Thomas Paine went to England where he was first lionized and then outlawed because of his pamphlet, "The Rights of Man." Some of Paine's life is told on Adventures in Reading.

**10:45, WOL**—Senator Rush D. Holt, Democrat of West Virginia, spoke over the Mutual network earlier. Now WOL rebroadcasts the speech.
