

# Double Feature Night Set For Kay Kyser's Program

"Foreign Correspondent" Thriller Is Due For First Airing; Zany Stars Plan Special Offering

It will be double feature night at Kay Kyser's College of Musical Knowledge Wednesday at 9 p. m. over WEA. "Who's Yehoodi?" featuring Sully Mason, Harry Babbitt and Kay, and "Playmates," sung by Ginny Simms, Ish Kabille and Babbitt, top the evening bill.
