Bill Stern Sports Spot To Be Heard From Chicago;
"Shop Around The Corner" To
Be Presented

Charlie McCarthy, with his never failing eye for beauty, has invited Virginia Bruce, popular screen star, to be his (and Edgar Bergen's) guest, Sunday at 8 p. m. over WEAF.

Bergen, McCarthy, baritone Donald Dickson and Robert Armbruster and his orchestra will bid a fond farewell to summer.

In order that Lynn Waldorf, football coach of Northwestern university, may appear on his program Sunday, and at the same time "keep an eye on his boys," Bill Stern's Sports Newsreel of the Air will be broadcast from Chicago on that day at 9:45 p. m., (EST) over WJZ.

Margaret Sullivan and James Stewart, two of Hollywood's brightest stars, will launch the 1940 season of the "Screen Guild Theatre" when they re-create their unforgettable film roles in "Shop Around the Corner" on the initial broadcast over WABC Sunday at 7:30 p. m. Frank Morgan, who also appeared in the motion picture, will fill the same role again.

Roger Pryor returns for his second year as director and master-of-ceremonies, with music by Oscar Bradley's orchestra, featured on the series for the third season, and with the same sponsor for five years.

The Sunday Evening Hour program returns to the air Sunday for the seventh consecutive season over WABC from 9 to 10 o'clock and will feature Lily Pons, coloratura soprano, with her husband, Andre Kostelanetz, conducting the 75-piece Ford symphony orchestra.
